## This London Penthouse Is a Well-Curated Gallery of the Best of British Craftsmanship

Designed by Studio Atkinson, this sprawling two-floor residence seamlessly blends modernity, culture, and craftsmanship into a warm and inviting family home

At this chic London Penthouse in Chelsea Barracks in Belgravia, a microcosm of the best of British design exists as a curated and thoughtfully crafted cabinet de curiosités. It features top-tier brands like Kvadrat, Rogers & Goffigon, Dedar, Pierre Frey, and Zimmer + Rohde, sourced from nearby design districts such as Pimlico Road, alongside Soane Britain, Colefax & Fowler, Collier Webb, Jamb, and de Le Cuona. Culture and artisanship converge effortlessly, resulting in a sophisticated, timeless residence imbued with modern aesthetics and classic influences.

Designed by Susie Atkinson of the British firm <u>Studio Atkinson</u>, this is their first ever collaboration with Qatari Diar, the developer behind Chelsea Barracks. Interestingly, the home's aesthetic draws inspiration from Belgravia's vibrant artistic and cultural community and the visible London skyline. "And, we were greatly inspired by the <u>significant outdoor terrace</u>; we brought the outside in through our bespoke interiors and <u>sourced antiques and artwork</u>," says Atkinson. "We've used local and British suppliers throughout, reflecting Chelsea Barracks' championing of artisanship and British talent." The 6,029 square feet penthouse includes a formal and informal living room, a family room, kitchen, dining area, study, entrance hall, terrace, and five bedrooms.

## Shop this London Penthouse's chic style

The <u>living rooms exude charm</u> with their harmonious balance of colours, prints and patterns, that range from botanical and geometric to textural plains. "Overlooking the terrace, I aimed to create a space that feels part of the garden," explains Atkinson. The Jean Monro fabric on the Studio Atkinson Weekender Sofa, a whimsical yet classic touch, anchors the informal sitting room alongside modern accents. By contrast, the family room is a cosier evening retreat, centred on a Studio Atkinson L-shaped sofa upholstered in Nobilis's Oia fabric.



Unlike the calm living rooms, the dining room exudes glamour, with Dedar's Amoir Libre silk moiré wall fabric adding warmth and reflection. Chairs upholstered in Studio Ashby fabric balance cool greens and blues with the warm palette. Glamour extends to the staircase, with rich brown marble floors, blackened steel balustrades, and deep red walls complementing gilded artworks. The kitchen, sporting wood and marble is a calming retreat flooded in natural light during the day – it also opens to an outdoor kitchenette and herb garden.



The bedrooms evoke a cocooning, homely feel. "I wanted to counter the simplicity of the rooms with textural fabrics, antiques, and layered elements that make the space feel evolved over time," says Atkinson. The bathrooms follow a serene, understated aesthetic and the large glass windows shine light on the colours and quirky marble patterns inside, highlighting warmth and character.

The terrace, the penthouse's crowning feature, serves as an extension of the interior. Adjacent to the wellness zone, it includes a sauna, ice bath, sunbathing area, bar, lounge, and dining table with a corten steel frame. "Hortus Loci's planting softens the angles with grasses and evergreen foliage that sway in the breeze, inviting wildlife and filling the air with delicate scents," concludes Atkinson.
